Expectations of Participants and Families:

- Timeliness is crucial to all rehearsals and events at Poison Apple. On time is 5-10 minutes early in the theatre world and is expected for rehearsals. If a rare tardy or absence due to illness should occur, prompt communication to the Stage Manager is required.
- The participant will be expected to provide requested shoes (likely black slip-on dance shoes) and proper theatrical undergarments. In past this has ranged from leotards and full footed skin matching tights, to tank tops and shorts.
- Participants are expected not to make changes to their physical appearance hair (color or cut), piercings, tattoos, etc. without discussion with the creative team.
- Participant's families are expected to volunteer for Poison Apple for production assistance which can range from duties including:
 - Cleaning/disinfecting before/after rehearsal
 - o Garbage removal
 - Recycling drop off to help pay our PG&E bill
 - Snack/meal donations for long rehearsals
 - Organizing/errand running/event planning
 - Sponsor gathering
 - Proof reading
 - Painting
 - Scenic construction
 - Sewing
 - Crafting
- Participant's rehearsal conflicts are taken quite seriously; do not expect to add conflicts once rehearsals begin. Please be sure to accurately note any potential conflicts with our process as it does affect casting. **Conflicts not stated at the time of audition are not excused, and must be discussed with the production team.**
- Participants are expected to practice good hygiene including coming to rehearsal freshly showered, clean clothes, toenails clipped, deodorized, teeth brushed, hair back out of face.
 - We offer the rest room for a quick clean up and aerosol deodorant for anyone who might need it at any time.
- Participants are expected to adhere to our strict non-discrimination policy.
